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Area & Location

The University of Maryland, Baltimore (UMB) consists of 61 acres with almost 5 million gross square feet of space in 62 buildings. The campus is bounded by Saratoga Street on the north, Pratt Street on the south, Eutaw Street on the east, and Schroeder Street on the west.

Just five minutes from Baltimore's vibrant waterfront, UMB is easily accessible and strategically located within a half-hour of Washington, D.C., where the National Institutes of Health, the Food and Drug Administration, and more than 50 federal labs are based. The Baltimore-Washington corridor represents the fourth wealthiest market in the United States and is home to the highest concentration of scientists and engineers in the country.

UMB is the state's public academic health, law, and human services university devoted to leadership and excellence in professional and graduate education, research, public service, and patient care.

DRAMATIC RESEARCH ACHIEVEMENTS

- Fiscal Year 2007: UMB researchers attracted \$411 million in sponsored project awards, the largest dollar volume in UMB's history. UMB's research enterprise has doubled since Fiscal Year 2000.

RETURN ON INVESTMENT

- UMB generates nearly 23,000 jobs with earnings exceeding \$1 billion, yielding more than \$2.2 billion in economic activity.
- UMB creates more than \$16 in economic activity for each \$1 of state general funds appropriated.

- Expanding Maryland's bioscience sector with what eventually will be 1.2 million square feet of lab and office space in 10 buildings for bioscience businesses
- Creating 2,500 jobs and generating \$500 million in capital investment
- Reinvigorating the surrounding neighborhood and enhancing redevelopment efforts

Community Service

UMB students, faculty, and staff contribute more than 2 million hours of service annually to residents throughout Maryland to tutor and mentor, expand access to health care, and improve the quality of life of Marylanders. Through community partnerships, UMB provides, for example, lab equipment, paid summer internships, career development activities, and health care services to local schools.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

- Only School of Medicine faculty admit patients to the University of Maryland Medical Center: 29,000 per year
- Provides service to 190,000 patients, totaling 630,000 patient visits per year
- Uncompensated care provided by UM medical school faculty is more than \$19 million per year

Community Service

DENTAL SCHOOL

- Only dental school in Maryland and the largest provider of oral health services to Medicaid children/HIV patients
- Provides service to 35,000 patients, totaling 122,000 patient visits per year
- Uncompensated care provided by UM Dental School faculty and students is more than \$2.5 million per year

SCHOOL OF NURSING

- Wellmobile Program: 4,000 patients per year
- Provides services at 14 school-based clinics

SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

- Maryland Poison Center: 60,000 calls per year
- Pharmacy services are provided to 1,000 patients in seven clinics for mental health/developmentally disabled individuals



SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK

- 800 social work students provide 500,000 hours of care each year to Maryland citizens
- Ruth H. Young Center promotes the safety, stability, and well-being of children, families, and communities

SCHOOL OF LAW

- Pro bono legal services are valued at more than \$3 million a year for the underserved
- Immigration Clinic student attorneys represent clients fleeing persecution in their homelands

In 1807, the Maryland General Assembly chartered the College of Medicine of Maryland. In 1812, the University of Maryland was chartered and eventually distinguished as the founding campus of what is now the University System of Maryland.
