Dramatic Achievements

- **FY 2009 - Awarded \$517.1 Million in Grants and Contracts**
- Yield - \$850,423 Research Dollars per Core Faculty

Return on Investment

- **UMB generates nearly 23,000 jobs with earnings exceeding \$1 Billion, yielding over \$2.2 Billion in economic activity**
- UMB yields more than \$15 in economic activity for each \$1 of State general fund appropriation
- 500 inventions over the last 5 years
- 900 issued and pending patents

UMB - OUR COMMUNITY SERVICE

- UMB students, faculty and staff provide over 2,000,000 hours of service annually to citizens throughout MD to tutor and mentor, expand access to health care and increase employment opportunities

UMB - HEALTH AND LEGAL CARE

Medicine:

- Only School of Medicine faculty admit patients to UMMC Hospital - 29,000 per year
- 190,000 Patients or 630,000 Patient Visits per Year
- Uncompensated Care Provided by UM Medical School Faculty: Over \$19 Million per Year

Dental:

- Only dental school in Maryland and the largest provider of oral health services to Medicaid children/ HIV patients
- 35,000 Patients and 122,000 Patient Visits per Year
- Uncompensated Care provided by UM Dental School Faculty and Students: Over \$2.5 Million per Year

Nursing:

- Health care for underserved valued at over \$5 Million per Year
- Wellmobile: 7,500 Patients per Year

Pharmacy:

- MD Poison Center: 60,000 Calls per Year
- 1,000 Patients served in 7 clinics for Mental Health/ Developmentally Disabled

Social Work:

- 400 Social Workers provide 500,000 hours of care to MD citizens

Law:

- Pro bono legal services valued at over \$3 Million for the underserved

UMB - TRANSLATING DISCOVERIES INTO TREATMENTS

- Greenbaum Cancer Center selected as a designated cancer center by the National Cancer Institute.
- Creation of the Institute for Genome Sciences (IGS) in the UMB BioPark. IGS already has been awarded over \$100 million in research funding
- Licensed 48 technologies in the past two years, including a vaccine developed at UMB to protect against Shigella, a bacteria that causes 165 million cases of severe dysentery and over one million deaths per year. Through the license, a \$2.5 million, Phase 2 clinical trial will be conducted in 2009.

UMB - OUR HISTORY

- The Maryland General Assembly chartered the College of Medicine of Maryland in 1807, making it the nation's fifth oldest medical school.
- In 1812, the Maryland General Assembly bestowed the name "University of Maryland," and Davidge Hall, the nation's oldest building in continuous use for medical education, was named for School of Medicine founder John Beale Davidge.
- The forerunner of the School of Law, the Maryland Law Institute, was opened in 1823.
- The world's first dental college, the Baltimore College of Dental Surgery, was chartered in 1840. The following year, the Maryland General Assembly chartered the College of Pharmacy, making it the fourth oldest pharmacy school in the nation.
- In 1889, the University of Maryland medical faculty established one of the nation's oldest formal nursing programs. To promote and enhance research, scholarship, and advanced study, the Graduate School was opened in 1918. In response to growing social and cultural needs the School of Social Work opened in 1961. A seventh professional school, the School of Public Health, was added in 2006 and is in development.
