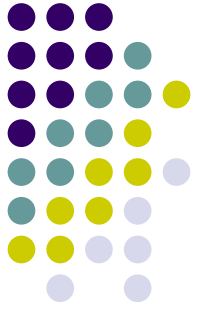


History of PJS:

Oct, 2005 - Dan Andersen and Julie Della-Maria began going out to meet the homeless of Baltimore City, taking out about 20 sandwiches once a week.

Nov/Dec, 2005 – School administration was contacted and 501(c)3 status was established.

April, 2006 – 3 students were awarded Schweitzer Fellowships to help fund the organization. At this time, ~30-50 sandwiches were made once a week.

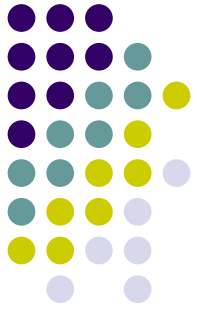


More History:

2007 – 2 students awarded Schweitzer Fellowship to address dental issues. Approximately 60 sandwiches handed out twice a week.

2008 – 1 student awarded Schweitzer Fellowship to address medical issues and another to address pharmaceutical issues. Now, 70 sandwiches are being handed out twice a week.

A student from each school that will e-mail the classes and place fliers around their school when we have an event

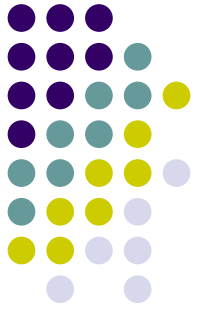
Hands **I**n **P**artnership representative:

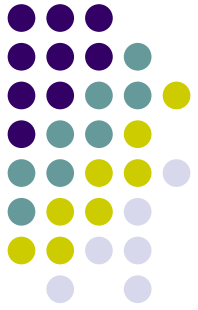
