## **Budget Overview**

The University of Maryland, Baltimore fiscal year budget is supported with funds from state and non-state resources.

State General and Higher Education Investment Funds (HEIF), tuition and fees, indirect cost from federal, state, and private grants, revenue earned for services provided to students, hospitals, and other public and private entities are the major sources of funding in the State budget.

The non-State budget is totally self-supported through restricted funds from contract and grant awards from federal, state, and private entities. Unrestricted non-state funds include revolving, DRIF (Federal indirect cost designated for research), and auxiliary funds such as housing and parking.

The budget is comprised of ten programs which reflect the purpose of expenditure. The programs are: Instruction, Research, Public Service, Academic Support, Student Services, Institutional Support, Plant Operations and Maintenance, Auxiliary Enterprises (non-state only), Scholarships and Fellowships, and Hospitals. With the exception of Auxiliary Enterprises, each program is funded with State and non-State resources.
