University of Maryland Baltimore (UMB) received \$ 1,038,952 in Higher Education Emergency Funds to award to students. To date \$ 1,038,952 (\$ 638,730 undergraduate students and \$ 442,340 graduate/professional students) has been distributed to students for living expenses, child care, technology equipment, medical expenses and books and supplies.

UMB estimated 629 undergraduate and 3970 graduate/professional students were eligible for funding. UMB selected students that were eligible for Title IV federal student aid as well as students who had borrowed a federal student loan during the 2019-2020 and for the 2020-2021 term undergraduate students.

UMB has providing Higher Education Emergency Funds to 377 undergraduate and 866 graduate/professional students. Students were asked to complete an online certification form indicating how they were impacted by the disruption of in person instruction.
