2023-2024 Estimated Cost of Attendance and Financial Aid

Carey School of Law-LLM Program

Applicants needing federal and institutional financial assistance to help with the cost of attending a school or program at UMB must complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid** (FAFSA). Please note:

- > Eligible students must complete a FAFSA for every academic year they wish to receive assistance.
- USFA strongly encourages completing the FAFSA at <u>studentaid.gov</u> no later than March 1st for priority consideration. UMB School Code: 002104
- > The 2023-2024 FAFSA covers the 2023-2024 Academic Year (Summer 2023, Fall 2023 and Spring 2024).

Estimated Cost of Attendance

The Cost of Attendance (COA) is the maximum amount of financial assistance available to a student in one academic year. The COA is based on residency and the flat-rate tuition charges for students enrolled in 12-14 credits per semester. Students enrolled part-time will have their COA adjusted based on the per credit tuition rate.
