Applicants needing federal and institutional financial assistance to help with the cost of attending a school or program at UMB must complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid** (FAFSA). Please note:

- The FAFSA is available every year on October 1st. SFAE strongly encourages completing the FAFSA no later than **March 1st** for priority consideration.
- The 2019-2020 FAFSA covers the 2019-2020 Academic Year (Fall 2019 and Spring 2020).
- Students must complete a new FAFSA for every academic year.

The **Cost of Attendance** (COA) is the maximum amount of financial assistance available to a student in one academic year. The COA is determined using each student's residency classification (Resident or Non-Resident) and housing (on-campus or off-campus).
