EDUCATION

Scholars who have earned a degree from an accredited institution of higher education from one of the above listed countries or from an accredited institution in the United States.

Required Documentation: Copy of Diploma

- OR -

Scholars who have earned a degree – or – are enrolled in a degree program where English is the primary language of instruction of the school or program of study.

Required Documentation: Letter on letterhead from academic institution that:

- Describes the writer's familiarity with the exchange visitor's English language ability;
- Attests that English is the primary language of instruction of the school or program of study:
- Provides supporting documentation about the school that demonstrates recognition of its degrees and its authority to operate under the education laws of the country where it is located.

STANDARDIZED ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEST SCORES

- <u>Duolingo English Test</u> minimum score of 115 [make scores available to University of Maryland, Baltimore - Graduate]
- TOEFL iBT minimum of 80 on internet-based test; minimum of 550 on paper-based test.
- IELTS minimum of 7.0 total bandwidth
