There are a few ways scholars can demonstrate English language proficiency.

### CITIZENSHIP

### EDUCATION

Scholars who have earned a degree from an accredited institution of higher education from one of the above listed countries or from an accredited institution in the United States.

**Required Documentation:** Copy of Diploma

- OR -

Scholars who have earned a degree – or – are enrolled in a degree program where English is the primary language of instruction of the school or program of study.

**Required Documentation:** Letter on letterhead from academic institution that:

- Describes the writer's familiarity with the exchange visitor's English language ability;
- Attests that English is the primary language of instruction of the school or program of study;
- Provides supporting documentation about the school that demonstrates recognition of its degrees and its authority to operate under the education laws of the country where it is located.

### STANDARDIZED ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEST SCORES

- [Duolingo English Test](#) - minimum score of 115 [make scores available to University of Maryland, Baltimore – Graduate]
- [TOEFL iBT](#) - minimum of 80 on internet-based test; minimum of 550 on paper-based test.
- [IELTS](#) - minimum of 7.0 total bandwidth
